The school district will notify parents (of students currently enrolled within the district) or eligible students (currently enrolled in the district) annually of any categories of information designated as directory information. This notice will provide such individuals with an opportunity to object to such disclosure in writing by a specified date. An objection to the disclosure of directory information shall be good for only one year.

School districts are legally obligated to provide military recruiters or institutions of higher education, upon request, with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of secondary school students, unless a parent or eligible student objects to such disclosure in writing. Such objection must be in writing and shall be effective for one year.

School officials may release directory information relating to honors and awards received; participation in official-recognized activities and sports, and height and weight of members of athletic teams as they deem appropriate.

In all other circumstances, information designated as directory information will not be released when requested by a third party unless the release of such information is determined by the Superintendent or his/her designee to be in the legitimate educational interest of the school district (e.g., aimed at promoting parent/teacher communications, facilitating internal school communications through homeroom lists, etc.) and is consistent with the district's obligations under both state and federal law.

Directory information as to a particular student shall not be released if a parent, guardian or the student himself or herself (if eighteen years of age or older) has objected to the release of that information in accordance with paragraph one above.

Nothing in this policy shall prevent the school district from:

Including in the education records of a student, appropriate information concerning disciplinary action taken against the student for conduct that posed a significant risk to the safety or well-being of that student, other students, or other members of the school community.

Disclosing appropriate information concerning disciplinary action taken against a student for conduct that posed a significant risk to the safety or well-being of that student, other students, or other members of the school community, to teachers and school officials in the student's school or in other schools who have been determined to have legitimate educational interests in the behavior of the student.

The District will also facilitate the transfer of a student's academic and disciplinary records to officials of any private school or any other public school in which the student enrolls.
